


Social Director

then enrolled in a NAUI certified Divemaster class. I also joined "Houston Underwater Club", & took a dive master certification, class with them. I went on to running trips every year to Cozumel, Grand Cayman, Bonaire, Roatan, & Palau. 
Advisor

Diehard Divers later merged with Pasadena Underwater Divers Club. When that club disbanded, they donated the money in their Treasury to a little known organization that had only been in existence two years called DAN.

"I was an individual member of the TGCC and was a TGCC Board member from 1980 -1982. Dennis Deavenport, I am not just a diver with a camera... Although I love what I do, especially in the realm of filmmaking, I've always had a passion for music, art, and travel. Yes, I was a professional scientist, but most of my spare time was devoted to these other activities in one form or the other. I've given up playing the French horn long ago after 4 years as an almost-music-major in college. Now my nights will often find me serenading my cat with random tunes on my piano. My need to create and experiment in art has traveled from canvas, clay, glass, and paper to digital artwork, both through creative images and videos. There are few things as exciting as being immersed in cultures that differ vastly from our daily lives. Finally, it's about friends and family and the ability to share experiences with others. There is no way to over-emphasize this part of my existence.



Tom Burns. My fascination with the underwater world began through watching Jacques Cousteau TV specials as a kid. Also, during a family vacation to the Florida Keys, we rode on a glass bottom boat out to the reef in Pennenkamp Park. So, SCUBA diving had always been something I wanted to try, but I needed a little push. Shortly after moving to Houston in 1989 to work as a contractor in the Space Shuttle program, my apartment complex hosted a pool party. SCUBA instructor Davis Graham was there with some equipment that we could try out in the pool. A few weeks later, Davis contacted me concerning an upcoming certification course and I signed up. Later that summer I joined a Cozumel trip that Davis organized. I was uncomfortable during my first few dives but by the end of the trip I had gotten the hang of things and was hooked.

SCUBA diving not only unlocked the underwater world for me, it unlocked the whole world in a sense. Before getting certified I literally did not know Cozumel from Cancun. Although I haven't ventured far in my travels, I at least know that places such as

Indonesia exist. So, to borrow a phrase, diving has broadened by mind.

But, as rewarding as all that has been, the real reward is the friends I have made through SCUBA diving. After I got hooked on diving after that first trip to Cozumel, I wanted to meet other divers and joined Lunarfins and Bay Area Divers. Back in those days, the Houston SCUBA community got together several times a year for events like Sea Space, the B.A.D. flea market and Trashfest. I have fond memories of attending and helping with those events. There were some awesome folks in B.A.D. but I eventually dropped out. because I had traveled more with Lunarfins. As the Lunarfins TGCC representative, I have made even more friends. I cannot imagine what my life would have been like it I had not become a SCUBA diver. Although I am an introvert at heart, being a member of the diving community helps me break out of my shell.

I haven't been on a dedicated diving trip for some years now. These days I mostly take cruises and enjoy snorkeling at the various ports of call. 

W E * D I D * I T !!! We got our first trip of 2023 out and back!

It was super nice, and most of y'all, well you missed out! Ha!

The weather was much better than we feared, but it was still not "smooth sailing." We were forced by a steering hiccup (it delayed us) to go a little faster than we'd have liked. We try to keep our speed down and give you the best ride! But we made it out the West Bank without too much shaking up.

We arrived at the West Bank at 7:30 (a little late due to a steering hiccup we stopped to fix) in a a lumpy sea, very comfortable though once we got stopped. DiveMaster Andy jumped in the water as the sun was rising to check out the conditions and lay a sight line for divers to use as a reference during their dive. The water temperature was a comfortable but chilly for Texans, seventy-two degrees. His 5mm shorty was perfect for the conditions. Visibility was a hundred feet plus and there was no current. A dozen great barracuda greeted him at the surface and a school of bar jacks circled him at the U-bolt. Juvenile fish were teaming between the coral heads on the way to the edge of the bank. On the way, he crossed a pair of white spotted file fish, followed by a yellow mouthed grouper which came right up to him. Watching from overhead, a manta ray hovered ten feet over him, basking in the bubbles before doing a loop and heading off into the deep. It was a spectacular beginning to a spectacular weekend.

During the trip our divers saw more manta, sharks (including a few hammerheads, lots of silky, a handful of sandbar sharks), loggerhead turtles, and among all the other typical reef fish, we saw a golden smooth trunkfish—Andy's favorite—which are only found in the Flower Garden Banks and the Bay Islands of Honduras.

The oil platform dive saw the usual cast of characters, the curious young silky sharks in good numbers, the Amber Jacks and of course the countless "aquarium fishes."

Overnight we quietly motored over to Stetson Bank. This is where the small groups of Hammer-

heads visited, not the large numbers associated with Jan-Feb, but still fun to spot out int he deep water. They, with lobsters and all the crazy animals that live there made Stetson a nice treat before heading back to Freeport.

We were also visited by an Albatross, a sign of good things to come. The trip ended back in Freeport at about 5:30 on Sunday.

We have some great trips coming up and they're all starting to fill up

Tall Ships in Galveston on April 15, 2023



Galveston will be hosting the 2023 Tall Ships festival. There will be tours of participating ships, numerous special events, sail-away excursions, music, food, and fun in a family-friendly format. Galveston Island will serve as one of three ports for the TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® Gulf Coast 2023 Series, which features a fleet of ships traveling across the Gulf of Mexico as they visit other participating cities.

The Tall Ships Challenge® is a series of annual events organized by Tall Ships America. These events draw hundreds of thousands of people to witness beautiful tall ships from the age of sail and provide a unique opportunity for the participants to interact with the crews of different vessels in friendly rivalry as they race from port to port.

The series began in 2001 on the Great Lakes and saw vessels from six countries and visited seven US and Canadian ports. Since its launch, the Tall Ships Challenge® series has visited dozens of North American cities, bringing millions of spectators down to the waterfront to experience the tall ships and creating a cumulative economic impact of hundreds of millions of dollars for host communities. It has continued to grow every year and is an eagerly anticipated event in the seaside communities that host the vessels and beyond.

PLEASE NOTE: TALL SHIPS® GALVESTON tickets are non-refundable. The festival is open, rain or shine. GHF is not responsible for independent transactions between visitors and vendors. All ships are viewable from the pier. However, on-board tours are not handicap accessible. If we can assist with arrangements, please contact us at 409-765-7834 in advance of your visit. Pets and ice chests are not allowed. Scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, skates, Segways, and other recreational "wheels" are forbidden.

This returning festival hosts tours of the participating ships, numerous special events, sail-away excursions, music, food, and fun in a family-friendly format. Tickets are good from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. (last tour at 5 p.m.) for the date selected. Fast Pass tickets allow to holders to access on-board tours ahead of the general admission line through a private queue.

SHOOTING UNDERWATER VIDEO FOR DUMMIES AND NOT-DUMMIES

THREE VIDEO WORKSHOPS ANNOUNCED FOR BEGINNING TO INTERMEDIATE VIDEOGRAPHERS

Three one-hour workshops will be held starting May 20 from 2-4 pm at Bayland Community Center. All three sessions will be in person and via Zoom for any participants that can't make it to the inperson presentation.

COST: NOTHING

WHO CAN ATTEND: ANYONE who wants to show up in person or who logs on via Zoom.

(Up to a max of 100 on Zoom)

CONCEPT:

I really want to keep this simple but practical. The three sessions will only deal with how to take good video clips underwater. They will not deal with editing and assembly into final films. The premise here is that if you are capable of reliably taking decent video footage, the editing and film assembly becomes a lot simpler and a whole lot more fun and satisfying. The surprising thing about UW video is that it doesn't have to be a black art. There are some simple practices that are easily taught and somewhat easily practiced that will make a night and day difference in results you achieve.

Yes, this is geared toward beginners and intermediate videographers but there are probably pointers that will be valuable even for the grizzled veterans of the 'deadly red button on the back of the camera'.

Session one will be spent on one topic: ACHIEVING GOOD COLOR UNDERWATER

Session two will cover: HOW TO TAKE STABLE UW VIDEO CLIPS

Session three will cover: TAKING VIDEO THAT IS CRITICALLY IN-FOCUS (plus other short topics)

Since there will be a variety of video systems that people will be using, time will be spent discussing how to best get reliable results from action cameras, point and shoot systems, and higher end SLRs. Following the presentation, questions will be fielded for answers and discussion.
