"Shipwrecks of Truk Lagoon" - Joe Campanelli

Joe started diving in 1977, while a junior in college in Rhode Island. Joe quickly developed a passion for diving and spent every available weekend diving shipwrecks off the coast of Jamestown and Newport, RI and collecting Lobster, Scallops and Quahogs. Engineering assignments in Connecticut, Pennsylvania and finally Houston, Texas followed, and Joe continued with his passion for diving. He earned diving certifications with NASDS, PADI, NAUI, DAN, TDI and IANTD, advancing through to Master Scuba Diver with PADI, and Trimix Technical Diver and Trimix Gas Blender with IANTD. Joe also completed a Commercial Diver Experience program through NAUI and The Ocean Corp and had the opportunity to dive with a surfacesupplied Kirby Morgan Superlite helmet and a Kirby Morgan 28 band mask, plus a 60 foot "dive" in their recompression chamber. Joe has experience in a wide variety of diving environments, caves, caverns, cenotes, blue holes, rigs, wrecks, reefs, walls, diving on a wide variety of Nitrox mixtures, HeliAir and Trimix. Joe loves WW-II shipwrecks and has made 5 trips to Truk Lagoon and 3 trips to Palau to dive the Japanese shipwrecks in these two famous locations. Joe is a member of Lunarfins and HUPS and previously HUC and BAD, plus a 10-year volunteer with SeaSpace. Joe was an avid amateur photographer shooting 35mm photos with Nikonos IVA and V cameras for more than 20 years, then switched to digital and used Olympus C4000 cameras for another 10 years. Joe's greatest memories of diving, however, are with his wonderful wife of 42 years, Bert and daughter, Candace.

Joe worked for Air Products & Chemicals, a major Industrial Gas supplier as a mechanical engineer for 35 years, retired, and then continued work as a machinery engineering consultant for another 7 years. His last project was support of installation, commissioning and reliability improvement upgrades on the liquid Oxygen and liquid Methane loading pumps for the SpaceX Starship program in Boca Chica, TX.

The presentation for April 16, 2024, is titled "Shipwrecks of Truk Lagoon" and will present the history of Truk Lagoon and will show the amazing diving experience of this tropical paradise.







Brion Saathoff — Argonaut's

I was going to write an article on octopuses and reproduction characteristics, and as usual I was sidetracked by a hyperlink about Argonauts (ADHD ???).



I'm still in Cephalopods I'm just focusing on the close cousin.

Most octopuses excluding the greater and lesser pacific striped octopus follow the pattern of egg laying, senescence and death. The male goes into senescence after fertilization and the female guards the eggs without leaving the den or eating until they hatch and then dies. In some species it can take a couple of years.

The female Argonaut lives on to reproduce many times. Male Argonauts are ten percent smaller than the females. A. Argo is the largest of the species the females can reach two meters long and the males are dwarfs at just a few centimeters. The female has webbed arms that are capable of secreting calcarious egg cases. which makes it slightly resemble a nautilus (a very distant cousin) which is why it is sometimes called the paper nautilus.

The male has a pouch under the eyes that has a third arm called a hectocotylus. The arm detaches and swims to the female, (after which the male will die) it attaches to her mantle via suckers. It then autonomously wiggles into the mantle cavity where it stays until she chooses to use it. She can store multiple hectocotylus's and fertilize eggs at different times so development will be at different stages. In the same case. Unlike most octopuses, Argonauts are pelagic and live close to the surface attaching themselves to floating matter. They will also attach to jellyfish and salps which are similar to jellies but more closely related to vertebrates and colonize by forming chains which are sometimes referred to as sea grapes. The Argonauts also use the egg chamber to trap air from the surface for buoyancy, unlike the nautilus that actually creates chambers in its shell with gas in them as it grows. As the air is not trapped the female Argonaut can change her buoyancy. They have also been seen in chains of 20 to 30 of comparable to size attached to each other floating on their sides. There are only marine and estuarine species of Argonauts there are no freshwater species.

There is so much more to learn about these amazing cephalopods but fear this article is getting a bit long winded.





Book: <u>Fen, Bog & Swamp: A Short History of Peatland Destruction and Its Role in the</u> <u>Climate Crisis</u>

A lifelong acolyte of the natural world, Annie Proulx brings her witness and research to the subject of wetlands and the vitally important role they play in preserving the environment—by storing the carbon emissions that accelerate climate change. Fens, bogs, swamps, and marine estuaries are crucial to the earth's survival, and in four illuminating parts, Proulx documents their systemic destruction in pursuit of profit.
