If you're someone who often skips night dives, David's presentation may just inspire you to turn on your lights and venture into the water after dark.

The second part of David's program will focus on the AI music generator Suno.com. He has used AI to create numerous songs, including the soundtrack for the night dive slide show featured at our April meeting. Suno and other AI music programs, anyone can create great music. As image creators, we often seek the perfect soundtrack for our slideshows or videos, and now you can make your own!

You can explore a diverse range of genres, from Texas Country to Jazz, Bossa Nova to Acid Rock, Classical to Dreamy House, and even Cajun Acid Rock—among thousands of other options. At the meeting, David will explain how to get started with Suno.com and share examples of the types of music you can create.

In case you're not familiar with David, he has been an active HUPS member since 1997. He has received accolades including Advanced Photographer of the Year, Member of the Year, and Lifetime Achievement Awards. David has served as HUPS President, Board Member, Newsletter Editor, and in various other roles over the years. He possesses extensive knowledge of underwater image making and is eager to share it with others.







Uluburun shipwreck

In 1982, a Turkish sponge diver stumbled upon what he described as ‘metal biscuits with ears’ off the Mediterranean coast of Turkey near Kaş. The find proved to be an elite shipment from the Late Bronze Age, providing precious archaeological evidence for the exotic and valuable gifts exchanged by kings, heads of state, or wealthy merchants. The Uluburun shipwreck was excavated by INA over 11 seasons between 1984 and 1994, with more than 22,000 dives logged to depths in excess of 150 feet.

The Uluburun ship was transporting a bulk cargo of copper and tin ingots, in the usual ratio of 10:1 to produce bronze. Other cargo included pottery (used, unused, and also containing foodstuffs) and luxury items intended for a very specific and wealthy audience, such as carved ivory containers, jewelry of gold and semi-precious stones such as carnelian and agate. Raw materials from distant lands included glass ingots, unworked elephant tusks, ostrich eggshells, and faience beads. Personal effects such as weapons and galley wares, balance weights and musical instruments including lutes with tortoise-shell sound boxes suggest that the ship was operated by a Syro-Canaanite crew and carried several passengers from the Greek mainland. In addition to the precious cargo, many stone anchors and a tiny bit of the hull remained, both of which are equally important in the study of ancient shipbuilding and its development. The ship itself was built of Lebanese cedar, wood that was prized in antiquity, with the technique of pegged mortise-and-tenon joints, and possessed a proto-keel rather than a true keel.



Close study of the cargo and hull remains of the Uluburun wreck has provided a special glimpse into the Bronze Age, its material cultures, and aspects of construction, economic exchange, and transportation. In general, this degree of interconnection of the Mediterranean during this time could have only been achieved through the intense maritime activity that is exemplified by the ship that sank at Uluburun.

No more paying tolls for San Luis Pass Bridge


Galveston County has voted to end the cash toll on the San Luis Pass Bridge permanently. The bridge, which connects Galveston Island to the mainland, has had a \$2 toll payment at the 1.3-mile bridge between Galveston and Brazoria counties, which was built in the late 1960s. Commissioner Joe Giusti said the San Luis Pass Bridge had been paid off years ago, and there was no need to continue requiring cash tolls. As the construction on Interstate 45 continued, traffic picked up at the bridge while drivers waited and paid the tolls. "A lot of people were starting to use San Luis Pass (Bridge)," he said.



He said the bridge tolls generated about \$500,000 in revenue each year, of which more than half goes to pay the toll bridge workers. The change is expected to happen within a month, and signage will be posted at the toll booth once it goes into effect. It won't be for much longer. Officials plan to end it by mid-May. Although the toll is going away, it may not stay that way forever. The county's looking to build a new \$100 million bridge

The other part of the revenue, totaling about \$5 million over the years, has been reserved for the bridge. The funds will be used to continue its maintenance. Giusti said they're assisting in finding new job opportunities for employees who may have been affected by the new change. Some had been eligible for retirement, and others could get jobs within the county.




