Betsy and Craig Beasley started diving in 1990 while living and working in Singapore and continued to dive sporadically during their working years. After retiring, they did more and more diving, took up underwater photography and soon began to shoot video and make films. Today, their joint YouTube channel, BC Underwater ([youtube.com/@bcunderwater](https://www.youtube.com/@bcunderwater)), contains more than 100 of their videos that range from contest submissions, travel videos documenting group dive trips, historical, documentary, biographical and restoration projects. As a result of their love for underwater films and filmmaking and with the support of the Houston Underwater Photographic Society (HUPS), they founded the Houston Underwater Film Festival (HUFF) in 2020. The Huff just celebrated its 5th anniversary performance screening over 50 films submitted from 29 different countries. They are co-chairs of the HUFF and Betsy is the Festival Director. Craig is currently serving as president of HUPS and Betsy is the video contest coordinator and edits the HUPS newsletter.

In their professional lives, Betsy practiced Psychology for more than 20 years in institutions, school systems and in private practice before retiring to be a teaching tennis pro. She finished her working years as the Tennis Activities Director for the Houston Racquet Club and still competes at the championship level in women's tennis. Craig worked as a Geophysicist at Western Geophysical and Schlumberger for 35 years where he served in a variety of positions including VP of R&D, VP of Data Processing, Chief Geophysicist and was named a Schlumberger Fellow (now Emeritus). He was the founder of Geoscientists Without Borders (seg.org/gwb) and they both continue to support it. They enjoyed their postings in Singapore and Rio de Janeiro and today reside in Houston.



Celebrating Juneteenth at Galveston's Reedy Chapel, the place where it all began back in 1865.




This weekend is going to be SO MUCH FUN!




A rare and beautiful capture of Migaloo, a well known brilliant white humpback whale. It was reportedly the only white albino whale in the world until an all white calf had been sighted just a few years ago. As humpbacks migrate annually to tropical waters to give birth, Migaloo and MJ (Migaloo junior) are a magical and rare encounter for avid whale watchers along Australia's East coast. They think he was around 3-5 years old when first spotted, which makes him 25-27 now. Barring an unfortunate accident, he may have another 50 years ahead of him.

They know he's a male from his song. While both male and female humpback whales produce sound, [only males sing the melodic humpback songs](#) that long ago captured our imaginations. In 1998, researchers first recorded [Migaloo singing](#)—and his knack for melody gave it away.



Everyone knows that the whale is a mammal, but what few know is that a small whale is breastfed, but not through direct contact like other land mammals... Instead, the female whale throws away her milk while her child is near her to breastfeed, but whale milk has a high-fat content of 50%. Therefore, the form of milk is thick and sticky and does not dissolve in water. So the baby whale can grab and eat the milk. A perfect breeding geometry.



Gold from legendary 1708 shipwreck—the San Jose Galleon

Gold from legendary 1708 shipwreck holding billions of dollars in treasure is seen in new images

More than three centuries after a [legendary Spanish galleon](#) loaded with treasure sank off the coast of Colombia, researchers have uncovered new details about gold coins found scattered around the shipwreck.

Dubbed the "[holy grail](#)" of shipwrecks, the San Jose galleon was sunk by the British navy near Cartagena in 1708, killing most of the roughly 600 crewmembers on board. The ship was believed to be holding gold, silver, gemstones and other treasure worth billions of dollars.


Now researchers have analyzed intricately designed gold coins found near the [wreck](#), confirming they are indeed from the iconic San Jose. The coins feature depictions of castles, lions and crosses on the front and the "Crowned Pillars of Hercules" above ocean waves on the back, according to a new study published Tuesday in the journal [Antiquity](#).

Researchers, including experts from Colombia's navy, studied images taken by remotely operated vehicles of dozens of coins that are scattered around the shipwreck nearly 2,000 feet below the ocean's surface. The study's authors said the exact number of coins on the seabed is difficult to determine "due to the dynamic nature of the site." But an analysis of high-resolution images from the remotely operated vehicles shows each coin's average diameter is 32.5 millimeters and weighs roughly 27 grams.

On some of the coins, researchers were able to discern the letters "PVA" — representing a Latin motto meaning "Plus Ultra" or "Further Beyond." That adage was used on currency to signify the expansion of the Spanish monarchy in the Atlantic, the study's authors said. Numbers depicting the coins' denomination and the date of minting (1707) could also be seen.

The study's authors said the coins from this period were often cut from gold or silver ingots. "Hand-struck, irregularly shaped coins — known as cobs in English and macuquinas in Spanish — served as the primary currency in the Americas for more than two centuries," the authors said in a [statement](#).

New and Improved Sanctuary Mapping Tool


The Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary (FGBNMS) mapping tool, located on the homepage of the FGBNMS [website](#), recently was upgraded to become an interactive map. This updated online GIS-based mapping tool hosts data layers for bathymetry, management zones, oil and gas activities, mooring buoys, and oceanographic data in and around the sanctuary. Numerous data layers can be turned on or off (via the stacked square icon at the top right-hand corner of the map) and other external data can be added to the map. In addition,

Before you head out to Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary, get the most up-to-date information available about weather, sea state, and water conditions.

FGBNMS dashboards (such as the Sofar Spotter Buoy [Dashboard](#)) can be found on the “Data Resources” link in the top blue box of the mapping tool. As a bonus, a new FGBNMS mooring buoy data layer provides buoy status information (present or not present) so that stakeholders can stay updated as they plan offshore trips.
