Lunarfins is proud to have award winning marine life photographers Burt Jones and Murine Shimlock for our April meeting. A assignments have taking them around the world to document diverse subjects- They have seen the longest underwater cave in Mexico to the re-wilding of leopard sharks in Indonesia. Their photographs have been published internationally, and “Secret Sea”, a collection of their photographs, was honored with the 1996 Benjamin Franklin Award as the best book printed world-wide. That year. Although now retired from hosting “Scuba Safaris” their photographic seminars have helped hundreds of marine life photographers improve their techniques. Burt and Maurine are renowned “critter spotters”, and their images often reveal habits and habitats of creatures many people never see for themselves. In June 2008, they began working with Conservation International as consultants on sustainable marine tourism. Their guidebook, “Diving Indonesia’s Raja Ampat”, was released late 2009. A revised and expanded sequel ‘Diving Indonesia’s Bird’s Head Seascape’, which includes Cenderawasih and Triton Bays, was published in late 2011.

Burt and Maurine’s mission is to continue long-term project is to continue exploring and photographing remote and uncharted areas around Raja Ampat and the rest of the Bird’s Head Seascape in West Papua. Now, working with Re:Wild they will continue to administer the BHS website while expanding its conservation focus. 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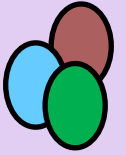

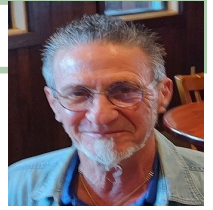

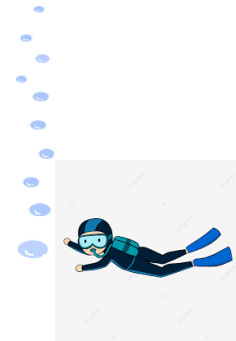
I hope to see you at this months meeting with Burt Jones and Maurine Shimlock.

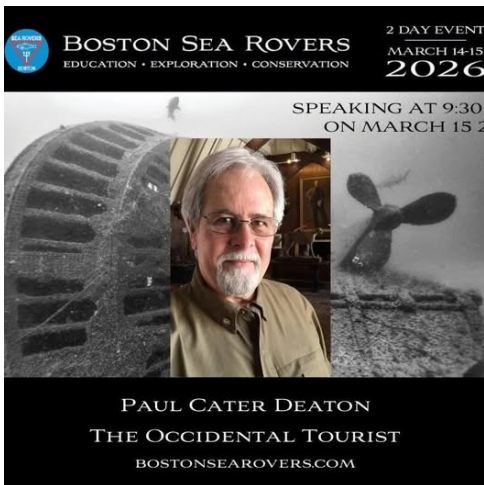


About our Members

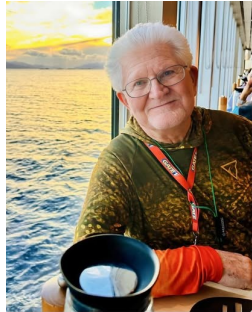

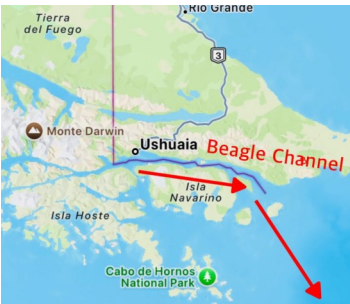
About our Members

Last two days were spent arriving in Buenos Aires, Argentina and a day tour over to Colonia Uruguay. Perry Kraus, from Atlanta area, is my buddy on this trip and we've joined up with a group from Atlanta and Birmingham we met last year on another Gate1 trip.

March 8th Ushuaia, Argentina Day 4 - Sofitel Hotel Buenos Aires - Early morning start(5:30 AM) checked luggage picked up, depart for EZE airport at 6:30. The first leg of our Antarctica adventure involves a 3 plus hour flight via Aerolineas Argentinas to Ushuaia called the "end of the world". The southernmost city, Ushuaia is located on the Beagle Channel, serving as the Argentinian capital. The province of Tierra del Fuego, means "Land of Fire". in Spanish. Upon arrival, we boarded HX Expedition's ship "MS Roald Amundsen", and made our way to our stateroom assignment. Just prior to dinner the ship left the pier headed down Beagle Channel.



So, here we are, somewhere on the Drake Passage heading south. Luckily, the Drake Lake today. Low wind and 3-4 ft seas. My normal good luck seems to be holding.

Soon after arriving in Antarctic waters, we plan to do a 3 hr discovery kayak jaunt. It should be fun barring bad weather. No guarantees on anything including landfall on Antarctic shores. Bad weather screws up everything on this trip.



First footfall on the Antarctica peninsula . No wind but fog in and out. Penguins made an appearance. A bit of an ordeal with all the regulations and precautions.

Day 6 - Hurray! We made it successfully through the Drake Passage and if there was no fog today land is in sight. We are within the Antarctic Circle, the sea is very calm. Spent most of the day preparing for activities in the coming days.

Signed up for the "Kayak Adventure" and "Science Zodiac" boat to help collect data for research projects. Attended training on safety & know-how for beach landings, fitted for special boots, and vacuumed clothing. Tonight went to specialty restaurant (Lindstrom).





The "Big U" is Going Down: Dive into History Off the Florida Coast

Get your regulators ready, divers. The world's next premier wreck trek is officially on the horizon. After decades of rusting at a pier in Philadelphia, the legendary SS United States is undergoing its final transformation in Mobile, Alabama. By Spring 2026, "America's Flagship" is slated to be scuttled off the coast of Destin-Fort Walton Beach, Florida, becoming the largest artificial reef in the world.

For the diving community, this isn't just another sunken ship—it's a submerged skyscraper of American engineering.

A Record-Breaking Legacy

Long before she was a "ghost ship," the SS United States was the pinnacle of Cold War maritime technology. Launched in 1952, she was designed by renowned naval architect William Francis Gibbs with a secret dual purpose: a luxury liner that could be converted into a high-speed troopship capable of carrying 14,000 soldiers 10,000 miles without refueling.

On her maiden voyage, she didn't just cross the Atlantic; she annihilated the record. She captured the Blue Riband (the prize for the fastest transatlantic crossing) with an average speed of 35.59 knots (approx. 41 mph), completing the journey in just 3 days, 10 hours, and 40 minutes. To this day—over 70 years later—she remains the fastest ocean liner to ever cross the Atlantic.

The Sunset of the Superliners

The "Big U" reigned supreme during the twilight of the grand intercontinental passenger service. As the 1960s progressed, the "Jet Age" took flight. Travelers who once spent days enjoying the ship's mid-century modern ballrooms opted for the six-hour convenience of the Boeing 707.

Passenger numbers plummeted, and by 1969, the SS United States was withdrawn from service. She spent the next 50 years as a silent sentinel of a bygone era, narrowly escaping the scrapyard multiple times thanks to the efforts of the SS United States Conservancy.

The Dive: What to Expect

Okaloosa County's \$10.1 million plan will place the 990-foot vessel about 22 nautical miles south of Destin. Here is what the dive profile looks like:

- **The Depth:** The hull will rest on the seafloor at approximately **180 feet**.
- **Vertical Relief:** Because the ship is so massive (standing taller than the Titanic), the upper decks will sit just **50–65 feet** below the surface.
- **Accessibility:** This "staircase" of decks makes the wreck a rare gem:
- **Open Water Divers** can explore the upper superstructure and enjoy the massive schools of fish that will inevitably call the ship home.
- **Technical/Advanced Divers** can venture deeper into the hull and explore the lower decks and machinery spaces.

Note for Wreck Enthusiasts: The ship is being meticulously cleaned and "reef-ready" holes are being cut to ensure she sinks upright and provides safe swim-throughs for both divers and marine life.

Preserving the Spirit

While the ship will find a new life underwater, her iconic **65-foot red, white, and blue funnels** won't be joining her in the deep. They have been removed to ensure the ship fits within the depth requirements and will be preserved as the centerpiece of a new land-based museum in Florida.

As she settles into the Gulf of Mexico, the SS United States will join the "Great Carrier" **USS Oriskany** nearby, cementing the Florida Panhandle as the "Wreck Capital of the World."

The Hidden Gulf features [Mesophotic and Deep Benthic Communities](#) restoration following the *Deepwater Horizon* oil spill while highlighting the importance of these understudied habitats to the broader Gulf, including areas in and around Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary.

The documentary spans approximately 30 minutes and features the creative methods, including remotely operated vehicles and saturation divers, used to reach and restore deep coral habitats in the Gulf.

Highlights of the documentary include:

- Vibrant scenes of mesophotic corals, fish, and invertebrates

- Never-before-seen footage of a large-scale restoration mission around Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary in 2024

- Up-close views of the technology used in the deep, including remotely-operated vehicles

- Interviews with experts, including those from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the Department of the Interior, who are leading efforts to restore mesophotic and deep seafloor habitats.

[2022 East and West Flower Garden Bank Monitoring Data Is Now Publicly Accessible](#)

The 2022 long-term monitoring dataset for East and West Flower Garden Banks has been successfully archived and published by NOAA's National Centers for Environmental Information (NCEI). This dataset contains raw and processed data from an annual long-term monitoring program documenting fish and benthic community observations, along with water quality measurements. It is now publicly accessible through NCEI under Accession Number 0312371: <https://doi.org/10.25921/PJWE-Y538>.

This release is the fourth dataset submitted using Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary's refined archiving procedures, and efforts are underway to systematically archive the remaining historical records.

Although Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary is known for its shallow, colorful coral reefs, these areas make up just a small part of the sanctuary!

Most of the sanctuary stretches 130-725 feet below the surface—deep into the mesophotic zone. Mesophotic means “middle light,” and habitats here only receive about 1-10% of the light from the surface. In the sanctuary, this area is home to black coral and octocoral forests that support shrimp, brittle stars, squat lobsters, and even reef fish.

Put down your smartphone.

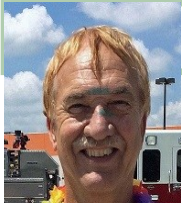
Open the front door.

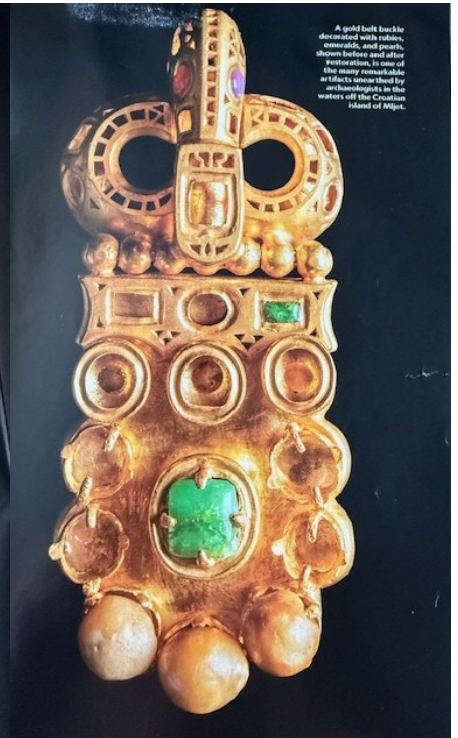
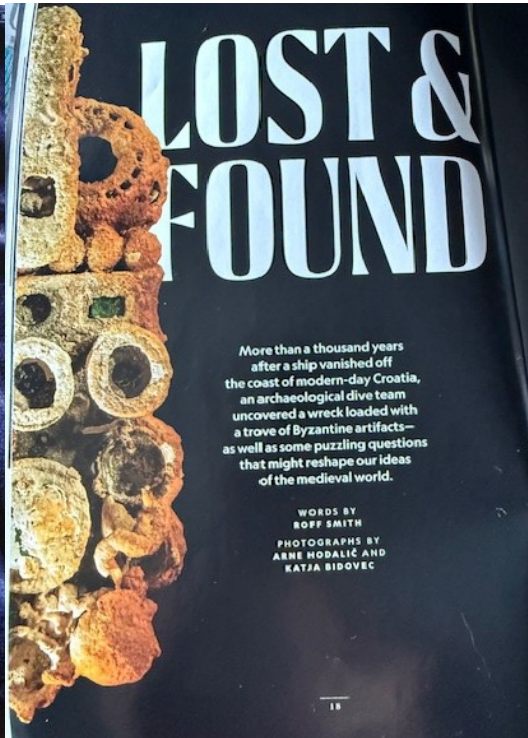
The Mystery of a Byzantine Shipwreck—Lost & Found

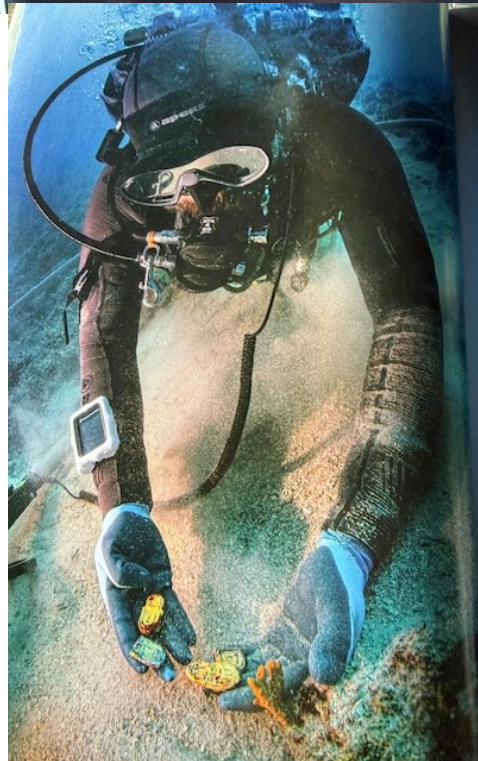

A gold belt buckle decorated with rubies, emeralds, and pearls, shown before and after restoration. It is one of the many remarkable artifacts unearthed by archaeologists in the waters off the Croatian island of Mljet.



Among the wreckage, archaeologists found gold coins dating from the seventh century A.D. While little remains of the ship itself, it likely looked something like the mosaic (opposite), which depicts a Byzantine ship from the era.

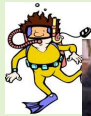

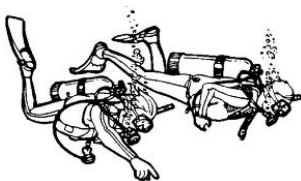
